Outcomes & Opportunities

- You'll have the opportunity to pursue two internship placements (150 and 200 hours), as well as a variety of community-based learning and extracurricular activities. The Counseling and Human Services Department provides internship placement assistance and has affiliations with over 100 local agencies and schools.
- Students appreciate the flexibility of the program and the opportunity to pursue minors in subjects such as Spanish, psychology or criminal justice. Students also have the opportunity to study abroad.
- You'll find counseling and human services graduates working in community agencies, rehabilitation services, behavioral health organizations and addiction recovery programs, along with many other local, state and federal services.
- Typically, one-half to two-thirds of our graduates continue into graduate programs for clinical mental health, clinical rehabilitation counseling, school counseling, college counseling and student affairs, human resources and social work.
