Theology/religious studies acquaints students with Christianity's long and disciplined reflection on the deeply human questions about the quest for God, wisdom and human fulfillment. While accenting the Catholic tradition, our inquiry into these questions includes other Christian and religious traditions, including Judaism and Islam.

Outcomes & Opportunities

- Students have the opportunity to train and work in the regional community in programs and parishes. Opportunities include campus ministry, church-related social agencies, retreat centers, schools and health care facilities.
- This program emphasizes critical thinking, ethical discernment, faith that does justice, and intercultural encounter and dialogue.
- Graduates have gone on to careers in teaching high school theology or religion, campus ministry, pastoral care or hospital chaplaincy, youth ministry, directing religious education, journalism, law, elementary and secondary education, government service, Jesuit and other volunteer programs and ordained ministry (both Catholic and Protestant).
- Many graduates are continuing their study of theology in M.A. and Ph.D. programs as well as seminaries across the country.
- Others are pursuing postgraduate studies in areas such as medicine, law, counseling, art history, clinical psychology, journalism and philosophy.
