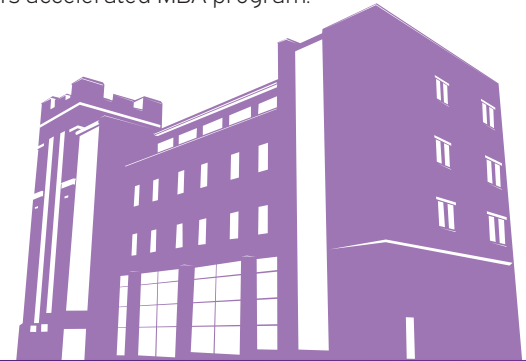

- Internships provide experience and networking opportunities, with students gaining hands-on learning at top companies like AXA Equitable, the Federal Reserve Board, and Morgan Stanley.
